Course Name and Number: Theatre Arts 34 - ADVANCED COSTUME DESIGN

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course the student will develop the following abilities:

1. Design costumes for one full-length theatrical production, sketch all necessary renderings, collect swatches, create and complete all the necessary paperwork, and concept paper for the designs; as well as execute the construction of one complete costume by selecting appropriate fabrics, and utilizing appropriate sewing techniques.

As assessed by:

- a. Evaluation of design portfolio by instructor.
- b. Paperwork describing concept and application.
- c. Ongoing progress, with evaluation by instructor, and the final sewn product.
- 2. Explore in more depth various approaches to design, color theory, sketching techniques for costume renderings, how different fabric choices affect designs. and basic costume crafts through understanding the history and recognizing the terminology of costume design.

As assessed by:

- a. Class projects, renderings, and tests.
- 3. Work co-operatively with the Staff Costume Designers in the Costume Shop, assisting with constructing the costumes for each Main Stage production for that semester.

As assessed by:

a. 15-20 hours of lab time working with the above staff.
