### **Student Learning Outcomes:**

Upon completion of this course the student will develop the following abilities:

1. Understand, analyze and perform scenes from Modern Realism by utilizing acting techniques that include but are not limited to identifying *Character Givens, Objectives* and organizing a proper *Ground Plan* and *Blocking,* 

As assessed by:

- a) Performance of three pre-approved five-minute Acting Scenes in the classroom.
- b) Paperwork turned in by student for each scene being performed.
- 2. Evaluate a play in terms of theme and dramatic action, communicate effectively as a stage performer and develop an awareness of theatre as an art form reflecting man's social experience and cultural heritage.

As assessed by:

- a) Performance of scenes in the classroom.
- b) Written exam/s set by instructor.
- c) Attendance at performance and writing analytical papers
