The documentary, which won a Special Jury Award for Masterful Storytelling at the Sundance Film Festival, looks at musicians such as Link Wray, Buffy Sainte-Marie, Jimi Hendrix, Mildred Bailey, and Robbie Robertson, and the profound and overlooked influence of Indigenous people on popular culture in America.
