She is an executive producer on Shudder's groundbreaking documentary "Horror Noire: A History of Black Horror." Projects with her husband and collaborator, Steven Barnes, include "A Small Town" for Season 2 of Jordan Peele's "The Twilight Zone" on Paramount Plus and two segments of Shudder's anthology film "Horror Noire." The duo also co-wrote the upcoming Black Horror graphic novel *The Keeper*, illustrated by Marco Finnegan, and they co-host the podcast "Lifewriting: Write for Your Life!"

II, is professor emerita of literature and creative writing at the University of California, Santa Cruz. She is the author of eight books, including the award-winning novel *I Hotel*. In 2021, Yamashita was awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award for Distinguished Contribution to American Letters by the National Book Foundation. She is also the recipient of the John Dos Passos Prize for Literature and a U.S. Artists' Ford Foundation Fellowship, as well as the California Book Award and the Asian/Pacific American Librarians Association Award, among others.

DOUGLAS MACGREGOR The War in Ukraine and the U.S. Response

Dr. Douglas Macgregor is a decorated combat veteran, former Senior Advisor

to the Secretary of Defense, author of five books, and a defense and foreign policy consultant. He is widely known across Europe, Israel, Russia, China, and Korea for his groundbreaking books on military transformation – *Breaking the Phalanx* (Praeger 1997) and *Transformation under Fire* (Praeger 2003) – and his recommendations for change in Force Design have profoundly influenced force development in Israel, Russia, and China. Dr. Macgregor also wrote *Margin of Victory: Five Battles that Changed the Face of Modern War* (Naval Institute Press 2016). He has testified as an expert witness before the Senate and House Armed Services Committees, and has appeared as a defense analyst on Fox News, CNN, BBC, Sky News, and public radio.
