IX. Discussion Items

9.1 Extending Library Hours. (Discussion Led By Jasmine Delgado)

Jasmine: I'm taking this time to let you all know what I want to do and to receive input. I would extend hours for the Library and the Cayton Center for finals week. Cayton Center 7:00AM-9:45/10PM. Library 7:00AM-9:30/10 PM. **Leslie:** I wouldn't mind Friday having it open longer, maybe around 6PM.

Lee: We found out that there is a huge drop off in finals week, far fewer students are here during final exams. Week before, are very busy, but very methodical. Many people don't know that the Business Lab is open until 11PM Monday through Thursday, Friday until 9:45 PM, and open from 8AM-4PM Saturday and Sunday. The college might be able to open up a classroom for students to study. There are already cubicles in the hallway for them to do so. Computer lab can hold 180 students at a time. This way we don't have to pay anything. The average cost to keep the Library and Cayton Center open longer would be extremely expensive due.

9.2 Endorsement of Sustainable Food Policy Resolution. (Discussion Led By Harrison Wills)

Harrison: I wanted to bring it to the attention of the Board. We are working on a resolution to draft to eventually vote on and take to the DPAC College Services Committee. Eventually we hope to take it to the region and state level.

Cameron: Students agree that they don't want to eat here.

Luis: Do you have a draft? I agree the food here is not good but we need some data and metrics.

Harrison: RFP, taking this to all local restaurants, getting quotes, and promoting competition. This way we'd gain dozens of options.

Benny: Have you thought of the rise in cost of these types of food? It could lock out students from these food options.

Luis: Do you have the resolution on hand?

Harrison: I'm just updating you all on the Sustainable Food Policy we are working on.

Dean Hearn: Who is the we?

Harrison: Kendall Bloom and the Sustainable Food Committee that meets at 11:15AM on Thursdays.

Jasmine: How would this organic food affect companies downstairs?

Harrison: Existing companies can't be mandated to change anything, but contracts are expiring. We do need them to label their foods. It would be a comprehensive reform. We've reached out to other schools who have amazing comprehensive food policies in place.

Luis: In the future, we shouldn't have it be a discussion item maybe just an announcement. I will come to the committee on Thursday to voice my thoughts.

Harrison: I'd rather have your input before I spend time moving forward with it.

Marco: It would be more effective to have text and make recommendations based on that text.

Dean Hearn: What are sustainable foods?

Harrison: It is both environmental and social issue and includes growing foods without pesticides or any dangers.

Dean Hearn: A good place to start is by educating others.

9.3 Sustainability Bill of Rights. (Discussion Led By Harrison Wills)

Harrison: This Bill is being worked on by the President of Heal the Bay. The Bill of rights would establish that it is a fundamental right to have a protected environment. We need litigation and law to protect the environment. This would be a great paradigm shift from our current situation. He is having an event in Santa Monica, and I would like to see if the A.S. would like to work with us and if we'd like to host an event.

David: May be an A.S. co sponsored event?

Harrison: Could get veggie grill to cater it and have a forum. It would be an honor to have him on campus. The event being held is a Workshop on Santa Monica's Bill of Rights on Wednesday November 16th, from 5-8PM at Santa Monica Fairview Branch Library. The address is 2101 Ocean Park Blvd.
