Sarah: Is this the cost for the ad?

Michael: This is a half-page ad in the corsair newspaper. I did it in advance for the vacancies. According to the constitution we have to announce it publicly. We use it to publicize our events. I have it for 14 weeks so the cost is 3,500. The cost came out as 250 per ad.

Okky: The ad is going to be about the election for 2 weeks?

Michael: I'll keep the vacancies up until they are filled. We will use them to publicize activities for the next 14 weeks

Ty: It is not for one ad, it is for the fall semester.

IX. Discussion Items

9.1. Hygiene on campus (AS President)

Ty: I have been receiving a lot of complaints about the situation in the bathrooms in school. It is has been embarrassing to explain why our school doesn't keep out bathrooms clean. I would like to take this to DPAC.

Michael: I definitely think something needs to be done.

Maryam: Sometimes they are out of paper. It is important that they keep it updates.

Okky: Do we have workers for the bathroom? I heard we only have 4 workers.

Ty: I looked up to see how many custodians we have, it said 50. Someone from the department told me there are actually 10 but only 4 of them are full time. I plan on taking this to DPAC.

Sarah: I have heard that these hand sanitizers aren't as efficient.

Michael: I think the hand sanitizers are better than nothing. I think they are important, especially once flu season comes around.

Okky: I also want to say that sometimes some people don't flush. It's nasty.

Ty: Are there any objections for a public member to speak.

Lee Peterson: The bathroom issue is perennial since it can be clean in the morning but dirty by the evening. Cleaner campus through behavioral change. 40% of our custodial time is removing

graffiti. They have a cleaning procedure manuals that tells custodians how to do their jobs. They use time minutes and figure out how many custodian work they have had and it gets shorter and shorter. This issue gets back and forth all the time. I wanted to give you some information for when you go to the committee.

Ty: I talked to Bob Meyers. Most of the custodians clean during the night. Personally, I don't think this is efficient. I really wouldn't mind they close the bathrooms during the day to clean the bathrooms.

Michael: There are periods of high traffic and low traffic. I recommend that they clean it during class, it won't have a big impact. I appreciate the speaker for giving us the information. That's good. We know what the problems are. I feel like the solution is more staff and better timing of the staff.

Ty: Whether or not we need more staff still needs to be researched. Apparently the department has been shrinking over the years. As soon as an issue affects the students we can make a recommendation.

Okky: So how much money do we allocate for custodial service?

Ty: They are supported by the college not us. We have to look at the college's budget.

Michael: I believe we are not allowed to hire anyone. We can't pay anyone to do the job.

Ty: It is something that needs to be researched. Maybe they are doing their job as best as they can or maybe the managers are allocating them to hours that are not as good as it should be. There could be a number of reasons.

Jasmine: I'm not sure what we would have to do. I have seen these hand sanitizers dispensers. We don't have a supply of the soap. If we are allowed to, we can purchase some supplies in the cafeteria. Having one right by the cashier might encourage better habits.

Ty: The people that are doing this are students. Maybe we can do an instructional thing. I know we aren't people's parents.

Michael: Once the mess starts, it spirals.

Ty: I feel that we can provide a white board for people to tag so that it doesn't end up in the walls.

Michael: Trying to stop tagging is a bit of a lost cause. Everyone who does it knows it's wrong. I don't think we can do anything to change that.

Ty: Thank you for your positive feedback.

Dean Hearn: there is nothing like information. We can invite the supervisor to ask those questions. I have seen cleaning in the day time. I know that it is a staff issue. There are certain toilets that take a long time to flush and students don't have time. People who don't know that, will just leave. There are a variety of issues why the bathrooms are not clean. Get more information about staffing. Be real clear about what you want to ask. It will help you deciding which role you guys will play.

Ty: Some of the toilets are automatic and some are not. Some people are used to automatic ones so when they use one that isn't, they forget.

Michael: Find me 5 people who have an automatic flusher at home. I disagree. You can't just forget to flush.

Halie: I know some of the hand dryers hardly work if at all. I know there are specific ones that catches water before hitting the ground. They don't make puddles that people step on.

Maryam: I agree but I think that people do not flush the bathroom just because they are afraid of getting germs. They are going to wash their hands or they can just do it with their foot.

Sarah: I really like the tag wall idea. Would anyone like to lead an effort on how to educate students better or work on the tag wall?

Michael: I serve on the DPAC facilities committee. I don't know how much scope the facilities committee has on the bathrooms. If you have an idea, talk to me and I'll bring it to the facilities committee.

Ty: I don't want to put a committee together yet.

Police officer: I would ask you to refrain from the tag wall. How do you regulate it? What's offensive to one isn't offensive to another. Once you get into that, you get hostility.

Ty: Thank you for the recommendation

Ryan Downer (commissioner & member of the public): I had suggested when I was running to form a committee. I have a few ideas

Ty: Once the committee is appointed and we have a better idea of what we're doing then you can bring your ideas.

Okky: Do they get fined for tagging?

Ty: The police don't' always catch them

Police officer: The reality is that we don't have a lot of people. If someone is caught vandalizing, they would be placed under arrest. They would face the courts system. Their education period at SMC would be put on hiatus. We would do the best to make sure that the member isn't a member of the SMC community.

9.2 AS Student Fees (AS President)

Ty: The reason why I added this is because we had some questions about the fees that are charged with the AS fees. I had students complain that we advertise a \$19.50 fee and they go to the bursar's office and have to pay 50.

Mava: We have no control over the health and ID fees.

Ty: My question is why are they being charged together?

Hearn: They are not. The health fee is mandatory. The AS fee is not mandatory. AS has no control over the ID fee.

Ty: So if a student wants to purchase the health fee but not the AS or ID card.

Jasmine: The health fee is mandatory. The ID fee and the AS fee used to be separate. You could choose not to get the ID fee. When we started using swipes they had to pay for the machines.

Those expenditures made the two fees couples.

Maryam: Does transportation goes under the Big Blue Bus?

Ty: I have no idea and we need to find out.

Hearn: There is a cost of the BBB. The AS pays half and the district pays half. The district part said that the 5 dollars transportation cost is being used a couple of ways. If it is still not clear, Vice President Tuitasi would be great to have to make it clear.

Maryam: Can they take the metro with the AS sticker?

Ty: No. Does the member of the public have important info?

Lee Peterson: The AS fee is legally, an activity fee that is purely optional. In that handbook they also talk about ID card fees. The ID card fees are purely optional. The bursar's office staff does not have the system that allows you to take out a fee. The admissions office does. I said it was against the law and they said they would do what they want. If the person does not have an

ID card, there is no way you can put a sticker on it.

Michael: Can they put the sticker on my regular California ID?

Benny: The ID had to be swiped now. The sticker doesn't matter anymore. Eventually you are going to use the card for other things.

Lee: The BBB people are switching from swiped ID cards to tap cards. There was a counterfeit AS sticker issue. People were making a profit off of it.

Michael: I don't need to swipe my card. I don't need my ID. Why do I need to pay the ID sticker fee?

Rosalyn: You need the ID to check anything out in the library.

Ty: If I pay all my fees but I don't have an ID card, then I can't use the library?

Rosalyn: you can't check things out.

Michael: To check out books you need an ID number and a valid ID

Jasmine: In the science LRC, you sign in and you need your ID number. Why are we paying for this card every single semester?

Ty: So we are paying for it when we don't get a new one

Jasmine: 3 dollars goes to the plastic and the remaining five dollars to the shuttles. The parking is never free, there are a lot of maintenance cost. However, the 10 dollars shouldn't be mandatory.

Ty: Why are we charging transportation in an ID fee?

Hearn: For me, my biggest question is why I have to pay for this plastic piece. These fees are supporting the services for students. As students leader we just need to have a clear understanding of the questions you are asking. I recommend that you pose your questions with Ty and then talk to me so I can invite someone to clarify.

Tv: Every time I go to the tent to validate my card, they are going to charge me?

Jasmine: They don't charge it when they swipe. If you want your AS sticker, you have to pay the ID fee. They are coupled. They used to not be that way.

Marvam: I've noticed that if I buy books from the book store. They need an ID.

Michael: When people are told that they are an as member for \$19.50 and when they are told it's more, they feel deceived. Now I have an even less inclination to be an AS member.

Jasmine: You need an ID card. We should be looking at the ID fee and why it is tied to us. The ID fee is necessary.

Ty: I think the real problem is how the small piece of plastic cost 13 dollars.

Michael: If you look at the fees breakdown. There are itty bitty fees. I feel like the 13 dollar fee is an effort to have the fees simplified.

Alex: I think that we need these cards and we should make an ad hoc committee and search why we need to spend more money on this thing.

Ty: So all discussion items are actually being brought to DPAC. We have 4 seats in this committee with votes. If you care about these issues, please come to the meeting. I don't want to be the only speaker there.

Jasmine: I hope that you propose that the ID fee should be changed to 3 dollars. I don't think they should be called to be called an ID fee when it's not just that.

9.3 Prop 39 (vending machines) (AS President)

Ty: Prop 39 is when we voted on supporting clean energy in the state. The colleges received 47 million dollars. DPAC is thinking about solar panels. The vending machines try to scheme with the cafeteria vendors. They made their prices larger and talked with the cafeteria and made them get their prices higher. I think they need to be more sustainable and healthier.

Michael: There are very few things on this campus that I can eat. The vending machine has one item that I can eat.

Alex: As another person with an endless amount of food allergies, I would hope that we would have vending machines with solar panels and healthy food, I would hope it would have something that people with food allergies can eat.

Jasmine: We will need to negotiate where the solar panels will be added since the machines will have their food go bad if they are in the sun.

Ty: I feel that it is logical to move to another more progressive sustainable company. I would like to know how you guys feel.

Jasmine: I noticed all the vending machines have the same owner. What if we can bring multiple different vendors? The vendors will be in competition. The prices will go lower.

Ty: I heard that Pasadena City College found this company that serve any kind of product you want and has solar panels. The companies can provide that. I know Pasadena is working with a company that gives some of its profits to the associated students. We would need to invest money in this too, not just the college money.

Michael: I want to know more about this.

Ty: Maybe we should visit Pasadena someday. I also heard that they pay their associated students per hour. If we support the vending machines, what would we like to have served there? I would like to go on Prop 39 ideas and how we would like to have the money spent

Okky: Can we have supplies vending machines? I have class at HSS and I don't want to run in the bookstore to get a scantron. My old college had one is every corner.

Alex: We can change the shuttles to more sustainable shuttles. Are there any other items? I'll make sure to put on the next agenda the types of food we want to see in the vending machines.

X. Director / Advisor / Committee Reports

Sarah: I know it's almost Rosh Hashanah. Happy Rosh Hashanah.

Michael: I am planning club awareness day and working on the Brazilian event on September 10th.

Maya: I put in the proposal for club row. It should be on October 31st.

Alex: I just ran over here from the curriculum committee. They just did a PowerPoint on what that committee is. I am excited to be a part of that. If anyone has any input, I would love too hear them **Michael**: Business card proposal is in.

Halie: So water bottle proposals are going to be in next week. I also had my first meeting with the environmental affairs committee. The committee seems very separate from AS. There are a couple of things they are working on.

Jasmine: I scheduled the first elections committee meeting for next week. Before our first elections committee, we are going to be talking about issues about the election. I will be documenting the clubs in the showcase right behind me. If you guys have any suggestions for that let me know. ICC constitution committee will be next week.

Ty: I would like to talk about the affordable care act known as Obamacare. It starts October 1st. A lot of our students qualify to be subsidized at a certain point. The AS should be informing students about
