


Brook: Promoting Earth Week, sustainability fair and green internships offering job for student. Showing the documentary call shows. Check out the flyer.

Arthur: I am the commissioner of the current Student Advocacy; I have been working more than 200 hundred hours. To meet with people who are underrepresented and



For clubs with food permits make sure they receive buckets, bucket water, and gloves provided by A.S.


Do not set up your own canopy if you are not serving food. ICC vice Chair created a map/layout of clubs present at the day for the event and will be handing it to Campus Police.
