

#### III. Minutes

3.1 Approval of Minutes for September 19, 2019 and October 3, 2019 Motion to approve: AGS, Seconded DSC

### **IV.** Public Comments

This section is of the agenda is reserved for members of the public to address the Inter-Club Council. A time limit of 2 minutes per speaker shall be observed.

Kate (AGS): Promotes to clubs to contact AGS if they need help setting up events. Wants to applaud the clubs for their hard work and for their events.

**Kiersten Elliot (Com. Relations)**: Oct. 22 will be a ribbon cutting for 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of SMC with free food. Later that evening there will be a banquet at the Student Service Center

**Tom (DSC)**: Wants to address the confederate flag that was on the ICC Vice Chair's desk. Addresses that ICC Vice Chair should step down from her position for this act.

**Jasmine** (HKSA): Publicizes the protests that are occurring in Hong Kong. Wants students to show support for Hong Kong during club row by visiting their table.

**Jacob** (YAF): Addresses the conflict surrounding the confederate flag in the AS office. Describes the ICC Vice Chair as a kind person and says that the flag was put there as a joke.

**Nico** (YAF): Shows support for the ICC Vice Chair and wants students to be mature about the current situation. Compares confederate flag to pride flag as a symbol of representation. States that he believes people who are offended do not understand comedy or satire.

**Carla (AS Activity)**: Clubs that are selling food at any event needs to take their waste to the CUES for compost. Health permits need to be submitted a month in advance. The process takes 2 weeks.

**Jasmine** (Activity Com.): Promotes Sustainability week that will be the last 2 weeks of October. There will be speakers talking about climate change and the importance of recycling. Is looking for students to donate clothes for the clothing swap 10/28 - 10/31.

**Reema** (Activity Com.): Invites clubs to the SMC Fall Banquet 10/18 and the Home Coming game 10/19. Banquet is a dress to impress theme, while the Home Coming theme is pink and green for liver and breast cancer awareness. **Noah** (Active Minds): Publicizes training for mental health for the veterans and LGBT1 + communities. Wants there to be fewer and more open political views in ICC.

**Brooke** (AS Trustee): Promotes a Talk to Your Trustee event to accommodate students with their concerns. Wants students to feel free to email her with their concerns.

**Joe** (**GSA**): Addresses that the comparison of confederate flag to the pride flag are not the same. Tells students to think before they act and that the student body will hold students to be responsible for their actions.

Gabriella (ICC Vice): Addresses the confederate flag she hung on her desk was joke and didn't realize the backlash she would get from it. The point of the flag was to point fun at herself not to make a political statement. She did not mean for it to portray bad intent and apologies for her actions. Explains that the point of college is to have open ideas and to have free speech. Wants students to reach out to her with their concerns. States that she believes Trustee Harrington has neglected her duties by voicing political opinions at a public forum and emphasizes that public officials should remain neutral and keep their political opinions out of their work.

Motion to add 1 minute: Music Club, seconded WiSTEM

**Dr. Rodriguez Lupercio (Dean of Student Life)**: Wants to excite students about Club Row but portray self-awareness during the event. Keep in mind that we are an open campus and students should contact advisors or police if they need help deescalating situations.




